Amy is also a voice over coach and her plays are represented by Ron Gwiazda at Abrams Artist Agency.

Clark DesSoye (playwright) is a retired marketing executive and has been a Studio Board Member for the last six years. A native of Western New York where he earned his BA from SUNY Buffalo, he worked in publishing in New York City for nearly 30 years. Since relocating to Phoenix in 2010, he has been enjoying the sunshine all year long (and not missing the snow at all), His short scene *That Christmas in Riverside Park* was featured in last month's *Holiday Music & Musings* show. He is part of the Studio Playwrights Group which has helped him develop new plays that he hopes have some social relevance, humor and resonance with audiences. 
